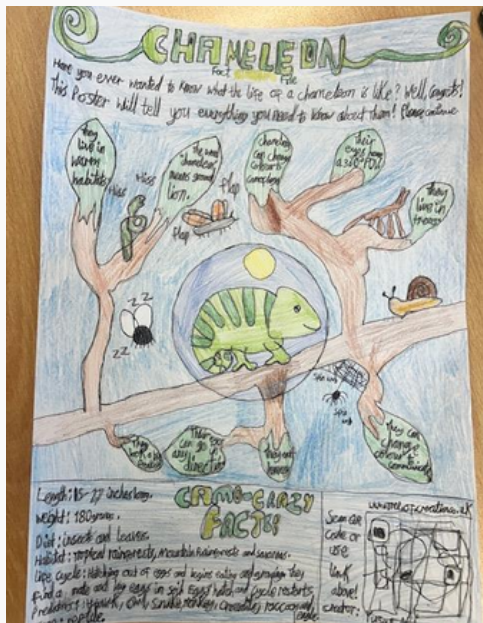

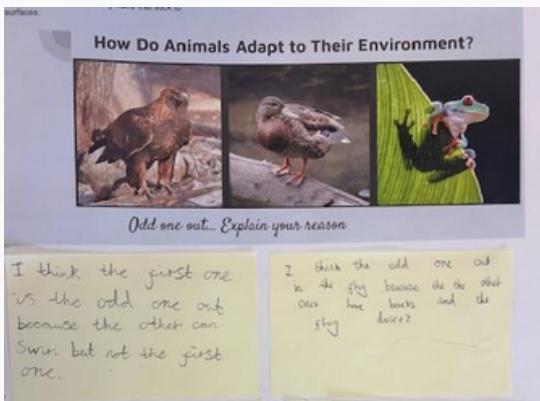
BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK 2025
