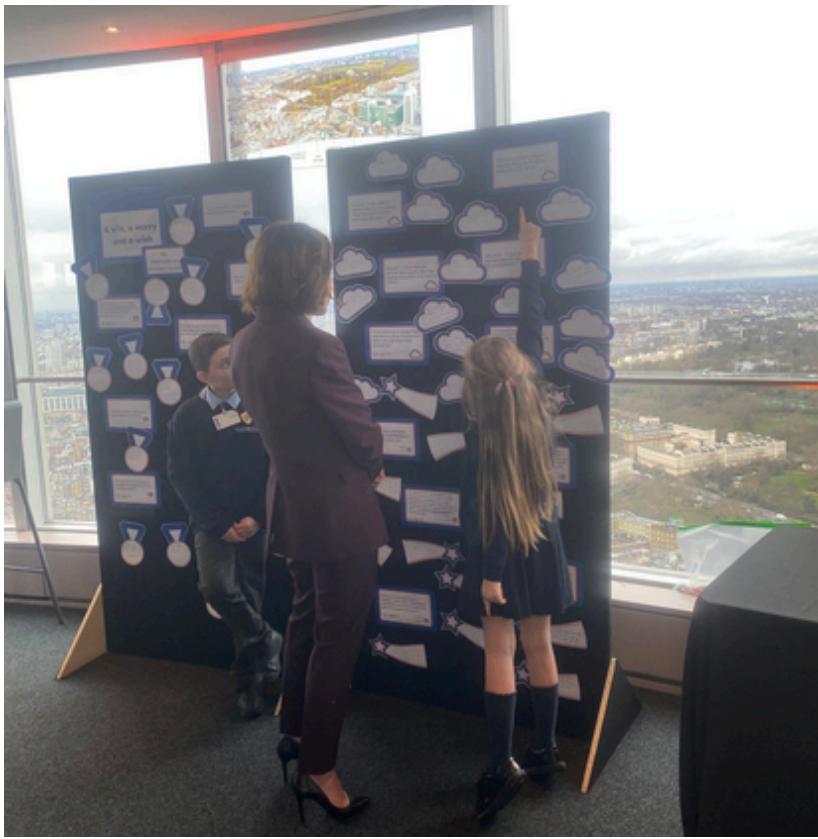


Y5 EID ASSEMBLY
